The Importance of Black History



Maxine Lewis was dedicated to improving the lives of the poorest and most vulnerable people in San Luis Obispo County, especially the aged. She was the founder of Grass Roots II in 1968 and a nurse at Sierra Vista Regional Medical Center although she gave her time, money, and dedication to a great number of charity organizations in the area.

"Convalescent homes and geriatrics wards are places to die, not to live," said Lewis. "I try to help people to stay at home as long as they are able. Sometimes all they need is a daily phone call to make sure they are all right." Her feeling was summed up with "give them a flower while they live — not when they are dead."

Black history is American history. Black history is San Luis Obispo history. If we are not making an effort to see our past from multiple angles, even the angles that might make us uncomfortable, then we are failing in our mission to learn from history.

Unfortunately we haven't always valued the stories and perspectives of our Black neighbors, and today the History Center's collection doesn't fully reflect the diversity of our county's past. This month we reaffirm our dedication to preserve *all* of our county's history, and to provide access to the past as a resource for future generations.
